

4.1 SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

4.1.1 The Dr. Douglas W. Ehresmann Graduate Award

This award (approximately \$500) is given to a graduate student in Veterinary Medicine performing outstanding research in virology.

4.1.2 The G. Murray and Hazel Hagerman (Gift of Verna Blanche Hagerman) Scholarships

This scholarship (valued at the cost of tuition for one year) is awarded to one or more graduate students in Veterinary Medicine for academic achievement.

4.1.3 The Dr. Errol E. Hancock Scholarship

This scholarship (approximately \$1000) is given to a graduate student in Veterinary Medicine from Nova Scotia who has the highest academic standing. If there is no eligible graduate student for two years, this scholarship may be given to a fourth year student in the DVM curriculum under the same terms.

4.1.4 The Dr. Ray Long Award

This award (approximately \$900) is given annually to one or more graduate students to provide travel costs associated with attendance at a scientific meeting to present research results. Selection is based on financial need and quality of presentation of research results delivered during the annual AVC Graduate Studies and Research Days.

4.1.5 The Pfizer Graduate Research Award

This award (\$2500) is given to a deserving graduate student working in a field which will contribute to the advancement of Veterinary Medicine.

4.1.6 DVM Graduate Program Awards

The Atlantic Veterinary College invites applications from qualified veterinarians for the DVM Graduate Program Awards each January. The competition is open to Canadian and non-Canadian candidates with a DVM (or equivalent) degree and an excellent academic record. Candidates should be available to register for a full-time graduate program at the Atlantic Veterinary College within 12 months of receiving the award. Candidates will be selected based on academic record, research experience, references, and research potential. Successful candidates will be required to meet the AVC graduate admission criteria, which include identifying a faculty supervisor and a suitable program that is currently available at AVC. Each award provides up to \$31,000 per year for each year of a Masters program (2 years) or a PhD program (3 years). Additional details about the awards are available at the Graduate Studies and Research Office at AVC.

4.1.7 Graduate Student Scholarships

The Atlantic Veterinary College invites applications to the Graduate Student Scholarship competition each January. One time awards of up to \$31,000 will be made to exceptional candidates holding BSc, MSc, or DVM (or equivalent) credentials and beginning a new full-time graduate program at AVC within the next 12 months. Both Canadian and non-Canadian candidates with excellent academic records are eligible. Candidates will be selected based on academic record, research experience, references, and research potential. Successful candidates will be required to meet the AVC graduate admission criteria, which include identifying a faculty supervisor and a suitable program that is currently available at AVC. Additional details about the awards are available at the Graduate Studies and Research Office at AVC.

4.2 NSERC Scholarships

4.3 CIHR Fellowships

4.4 Departmental Funding

Individual Departments in AVC may have funding available for personal support, travel to scientific meetings, or other research-related expenses. The student should consult with the Department Chair about such possibilities.

4.5 The Hooper/Klarenbach Research Graduate Scholarship

Granted to a graduate student at UPEI studying neuroscience. The award is valued at \$12,000 and is renewable for one year dependent on satisfactory progress in the graduate program. Application deadline is March 15.

4.6 The Hon. Dr. M. Lorne Bonnell Memorial Scholarship for Graduate Studies in Health Sciences

A \$2,500 award available to full-time students who are Canadian citizens entering the first years of a Master of Science at UPEI or the Atlantic Veterinary College. The scholarship is renewable for one year conditional upon satisfactory progress in the graduate program as determined by the Graduate Research Committee. Application Deadline is March 15.
